Leon County Tax Collector Opens a New Full-service Customer Center in the Neil Kirkman Building, Headquarters of the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles

Doris Maloy, Tax Collector – Leon County, is pleased to announce the October 18, 2017 opening of a newly constructed full-service customer center located on the first floor of the Neil Kirkman Building at 2900 Apalachee Parkway near Capital Circle Southeast. This new service center has been developed in partnership with the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, whose headquarters offices occupy the remainder of this building.

Area residents can visit this location to process Titling and Registration of Motor Vehicles, Vessels, and Mobile Homes as well as Driver Licensing, Disabled Parking Permits, Hunting & Fishing licensing, Duplicate Florida Birth Certificates as well as the payment of Property Taxes.

Mrs. Maloy said, "Our long-standing and very popular Customer Service Center located at 1210 Capital Circle Southeast in the Cross Creek Plaza will be closed as we transfer all our experienced personnel to staff the newly constructed facility on the first floor of the nearby building that houses the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles."
